Association of Confessional Baptist Churches in the United Kingdom Report of Association Day – 27th September 2025

Approximately fifty people met at Countesthorpe Baptist Church on Saturday the 27th of September to come together for the Association's third annual Association Day.

Trinity Baptist Church's newly minted Pastor Benedict Allmand-Smith kicked the day off with a thorough treatment of chapter six of the Second London Baptist Confession, on sin, the fall, and the punishment thereof. Pr. Benedict looked at the state in which man was created, the nature of the covenant of works, before elucidating the consequences for all of humanity of Adam's failure to keep it. He answered thorny questions such as how it is that we inherit the guilt of Adam's first sin and the justice of God in doing so. Pr. Benedict is a credit to the International Reformed Baptist Seminary which trained him, and from which he recently graduated with a Masters in Divinity. Following this, Er. Darrin Gilchrist lectured on the life of the great Welsh Particular Baptist Joseph (Gomer) Harris. A seldom known figure today, Gomer Harris was a Confessional Baptist who founded the first ever Welsh speaking newspaper, was a bulldog for the truth of the orthodox faith in Wales, as well as being a faithful Pastor of several decades.

After a lunch of pulled pork, the meeting reconvened to hear from the messengers of the six churches. The first thing each messenger shared was the current state of the church's ministry, which Scripture has been preached on the Lord's Day, and which has been studied in midweek meetings. The reports largely consisted of encouragements as churches report expanding membership rolls.

The day concluded with the business meeting, where there was much discussion over how to support the work of Reformed Baptist Missions abroad and sharing the various practices of the member churches in fencing the Lord's Table.

The association will be meeting next on 3rd of February, at Stanley Park Church, Liverpool. Acclaimed historian Dr Rober Strivens will give an address on chapter seven of the Confession, on God's covenant.
