APC decided to move from Nakuru town in 2025 to Bumala in 2026 due to low numbers the last couple of years in Nakuru. On our way to Eldoret we stopped and had lunch with Mark Koech one of the pastors from AIC Nakuru with the hope to revive the Nakuru conference in the near future. It proved to be a good decision and the conference was held at Reformed Theological Seminary in Bumala run by Eric Ngalo. Thanks to Ps Murungi Igweta of TBC Nairobi who made the arrangements.

The attendance was very good and we were particularly encouraged by some Congolese brothers who attended the conference who are studying at RTS in Bumala. It was good to speak to them through a translator to hear of the sorrows they encounter in Congo because of the ongoing skirmishes.

This conference was marked by a question raised by one of the delegates of the destiny of a Christian who commits suicide. The question came in response to Ps Million using an illustration in one of his sermons of a recent case in Zambia where a Bishop refused to attend the burial of one of his congregants after he committed suicide. It sparked a heated debate on the subject that simmered on the last day of the conference. It was perhaps particularly helpful in revealing the theological perspectives of many of the delegates.

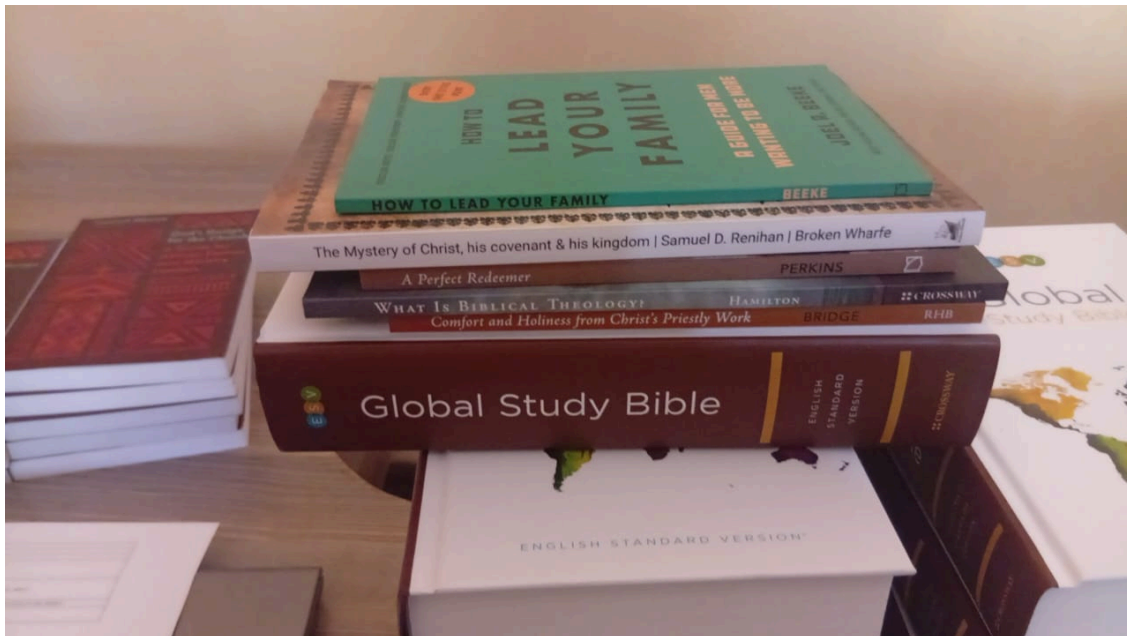
We hope to return to Bumala next year God willing and to mobilize pastors from Uganda since the town lies very close to the border.

### **Kisumu, Kenya 21-22 April 2026**

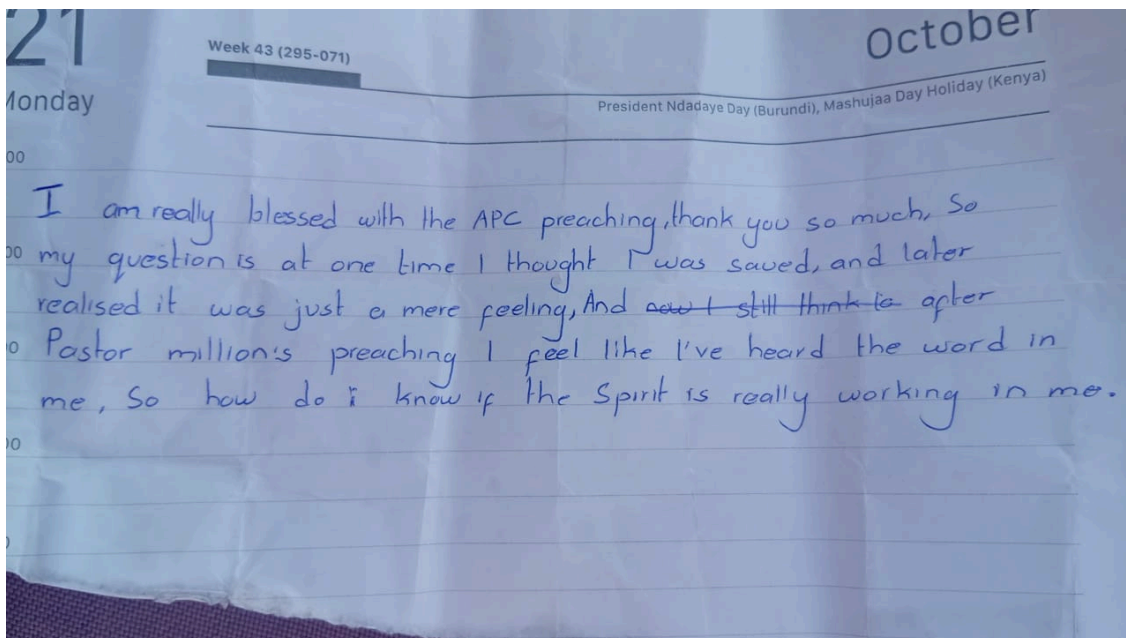

On our way we saw and stopped at the AIC Seminary just outside Kericho. The students were busy with exams so sadly they were unable to attend the conference but we made some friends and hopefully in future they will be able to attend. In town I was able to meet with the pastors of the AIC church in the center of Kericho and invited to hold the conference there next year. In the Lord's providence the area bishop Patrick was also making the rounds and I was able to spend some time with him. After speaking with the pastor at the CITAM church in Kericho, we were also invited to

have the conference at their church next year.

Bro Alfred from Mombasa was kind enough to assist APC in translating the sermons into Swahili.

The attendance was small but we were able to spend some time engaging with the respective delegates.

We were encouraged by the ongoing ministry of Arise and Shine on the church premises that cares for disabled children in the area.

The APC continues to play a significant role in the growth and development of these young men and women in exposing them to sound Biblical teachings and good reformed literature. The conferences also expose many to a Christianity that is vastly different to what they are accustomed to. Also, seeing fellow black Africans preaching in a way that prior, they only associated with white, conservative men. The book sales were good, especially when one remembers that many were students.

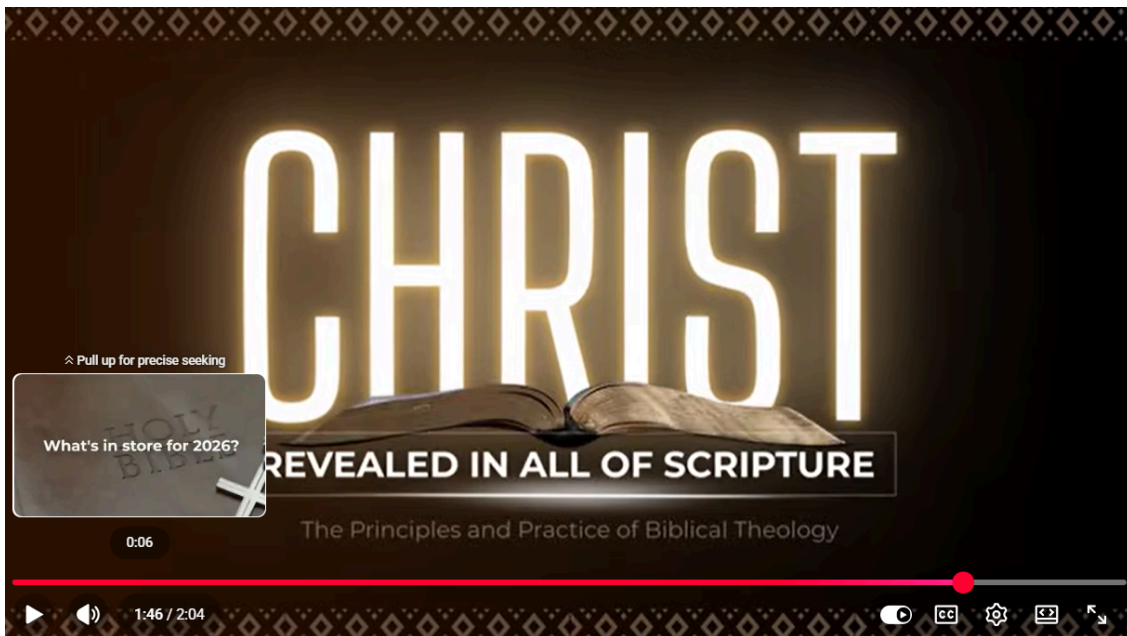

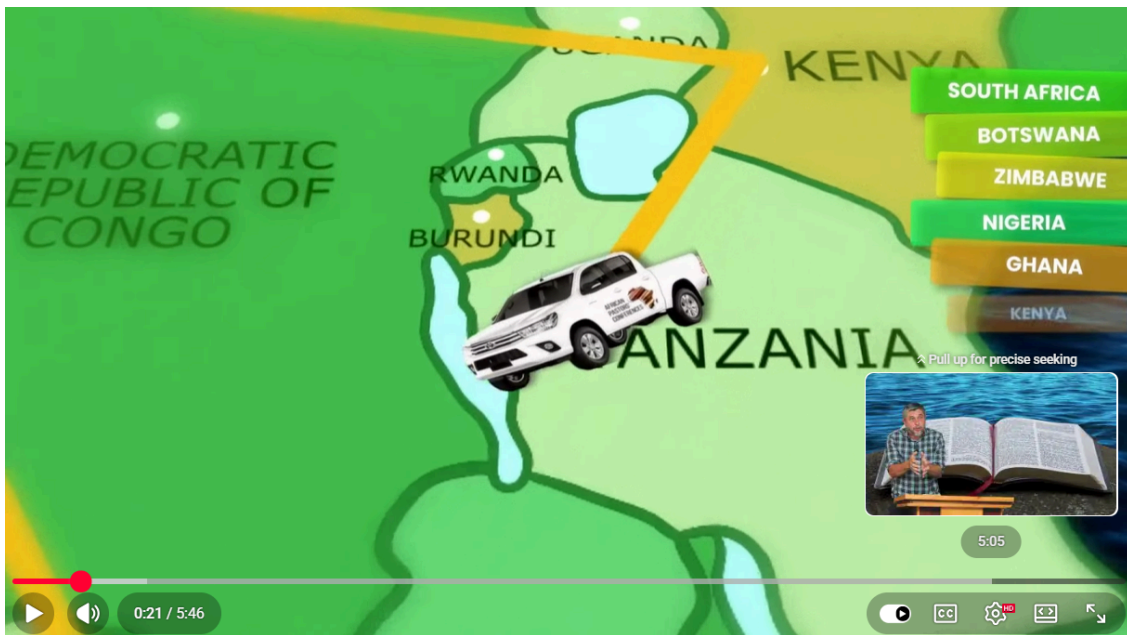
