Church Activities

(a) Vacation Bible School

It is our church's tradition to utilize school holidays to invite children of all ages—including friends and neighboring children—to teach them God's Word. This took place from 7th to 11th April, with an average attendance of about 70 children.



I was given the opportunity to teach the teens class, which served as a valuable evangelistic opportunity. Please pray for the salvation of the children who attended and for an increase in laborers for such ministries.

(b) Passion for Mission

This was one of the most enjoyable events of April. We hosted eight speakers: one from the US, six local church planters, and one of our elders. Each speaker addressed different aspects of the theme "The Great Commandment of Commission." We enjoyed friendly interactions, and many questions were asked and answered. I was especially encouraged in the God's call to ministry, even when it might involve personal cost.

(c) Youth Hangout

April was indeed a busy month. The Youth Hangout was a new and enriching experience for me. Most attendees were unmarried young people. We enjoyed fellowship, games, and conversations as we reasoned together as singles. Pastor Tito led us in a very challenging and edifying message on purity, focusing on Colossians 3:1–17. It was a timely reminder about holiness in the Christian life.

(d) Visit to UGCC

Together with Brother Tito, who was invited to preach twice, we visited Upendo Gospel Community Church (UGCC), a newly planted church near Nairobi under TBCN. We enjoyed sweet fellowship with the brethren there. The two elders, Joe Thwagi and Kevin Nyagaga, are faithfully laboring to serve the congregation and reach many souls in that area. Though they face various challenges, they remain encouraged by God's faithfulness. This visit reminded me that even TBC Nairobi had humble beginnings. Please pray for these brothers and their ministry.

Kamketo Visit Postponed
