**Greetings from Thailand in the precious Name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ**

The last two months have been eventful. Roxanne and my Thai are improving. Monday-Friday we are still going to language school, and we practise our Thai with our teachers and others. I must say, for me it is now easier to talk; I do not grope for words as I used to. Reading Thai has helped me a lot, and I'm overjoyed to be able to memorise Bible verses in Thai. Eventually Matt and I want to translate theological books into Thai as well. I am also amazed to hear Roxanne talk in Thai, although we both need more time to improve. At Sovereign Grace Fellowship it is going well by God's grace. We have had visitors from the Philippines and Texas and Thai locals to our Thai Bible studies and English services. **Pray that more would come and stay.** Matt and I finished Matthew 26-28 last week. I started to preach on Matthew in 2019 and finally finished with Matt's help. We now turn to Genesis. Furthermore, we are working through

the 1689 confession during our Bible hours on Sunday's. **Pray that our fellowship would be a blessing to all those who come.** Some of our members are on furlough in the States, and others are also going soon. Nara, a member, just had a baby; his name is Timothy. We are so excited for Moo and Nara. Recently Nicolas had his sixth birthday, and he got a new bicycle. He will also be going to school in August at Crics, an international Christian school. Roxanne applied for a kindergarten job at Crics as well and got accepted. **Pray for Roxanne as she prepares herself for this new challenge.** She is brimming with excitement to teach kindergarten again. We will finish our language classes at the end of June. I will then continue two classes a week. I also switched to a volunteer visa and working for the Way Foundation. I am going to start teaching 4 classes a week at a local high school. My subject is substance abuse. I'm looking forward to teaching these and making more connections with the locals. I will be teaching in English but hope to practise my Thai and share the gospel and my testimony as well during these classes. **Pray for me as I prepare my lessons and my classes.** In March we had a group of twelve men (some pastors) from Laos. We did workbook 1 on the attributes of God and had a good time. I also practised my Thai. In Laos they speak Laotian, and it's similar to Thai. I'm glad they understood the phrases I used in Thai. In April I went to Mae Ai again, and I preached through Romans 9-16 during a workshop. My preparations were time-consuming but rewarding, and I received good feedback from them. One said they have never heard people preach expositively like this. Matt and I wanted to model expository preaching. We will have two more workshops in Mae Ai in 2026.

God willing, I will start with a new group next year in Mae Ai. In May Matt, Benedict and I will teach through workbook 2, on salvation, with the group from Laos. Pray for these men. Laos is a closed country; persecution of believers takes place, which makes it difficult for them to access religious materials and get support. The men who came said they don't have physical Bibles; they only use it on their phones. We plan to buy them when they come again. God willing, I'm planning to go to India at the end of July and do three workshops with the groups I started last year. I plan to go twice this year and already got my visa to go. We are excited to have visitors coming from England in May, Benedict and his family. **Please be praying for these workshops and what the men and pastors receive. Pray that God would bless the preaching of his gospel.** Grace to you all! Nico, Nicolas, and Rox.
