We thank God for your partnership in the gospel in Asia and Thailand. May God bless you. **"Seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness and all these things will be added unto you" (Matt 6:33).** Most of my Christian life has revolved around this verse. It has challenged me, and the promise contained in it has given me joyful hope. I have witnessed repeatedly how God is faithful in fulfilling this promise through Jesus Christ in my life and in my family. The 3rd of August is supremely special to us, because 9 years ago Roxanne and I were joined in marriage. **(Pic below: the group from Laos).** We were both in our



40s and waited and prayed for years for a suitable spouse. I am grateful to God for Roxanne, her help, love, and support, and we pray for many years of God's

favor and blessing on our lives. We thank God also for Nicolas, who is a tremendous joy in our lives, and we are grateful for his joy and liveliness. One year ago, also on the third of August, we officially constituted Sovereign Grace Fellowship with 10 members. We thank God for this privilege, and we have received many visitors. We also started a Thai Bible study initially and now a monthly Thai worship service. We have started small, but few are interested in coming. As the Bible says, "Do not despise the day of small beginnings." By God's grace our church is doing well; Matt and I have started preaching through Genesis. We also continue teaching through the 1689 Baptist confession, and Roxanne and Danielle are teaching the children. Our sermons can be listened to on our **YouTube channel: Sovereign Grace Fellowship Chiang Rai.** In the last two months I preached twice in Thai. It has been challenging, but I have received good feedback, and it has encouraged me to study Thai more; there is definitely room for improvement. **Pray also that our church would be a blessing to all those who come as we reach Thai speakers.** Roxanne will start teaching kindergarten as a volunteer at CRICS this week. CRICS is an international Christian school in Chiang Rai. **Pray for Roxanne as she prepares herself for this new challenge.** It is a great opportunity for her to influence and teach the young ones with the gospel. **Pray also for Nicolas, who will start Grade 1 at CRICS in August. Pray also for my co-elder,**

Matt Jenson, who is also starting to teach at Crics. He hopes to go on a missionary visa soon, but in the interim, he is going to teach at Crics to remain on a work visa. I currently work at the Way Foundation as a volunteer; this helps me remain on a work permit in Thailand. I currently teach about substance abuse at a high school, 4 hours a week. **Pray for me as I prepare my lessons and that God would give me opportunities to share the gospel.** July was a busy month for me. I went to India for a week and taught two workshops in Rayagada and in Gorsa, Kakinada. These were the same groups I visited last year. I taught workshop three on family, social, and ethical topics in Rayagada. I hope to go in October again



and finish the last worship there. I also finished teaching workshop 1 on the attributes of God. I received good feedback, and they all want more teaching. Jeebit has recovered well from his accident and is ready to teach the workshops to other groups in the Odisha state. Ravi, my translator and organizer in Kakinada, is also eager for me to come again. There are great needs in India.. Thank you to those who have contributed towards help for the persecuted and who have sent money for Bibles. The words "What have you done to the least of these my brothers, you

have done it to me" of Jesus in Matthew 25 come to mind. **Pray for our workshops and that the pastors that came would remember what they learned and teach it to their congregations.** Paul said in Ephesians 3:10 his aim was to "preach the unsearchable riches of Christ," and so it should be our aim as well. Christ is a treasure that has no end. I have already received requests from two other places in India. Timothy Two works with this model: we train and disciple these men so that they can go and teach others also. Some men become National Missionary Partners. If there are enough funds available, they do their own workshops in various locations in their own country, and so the gospel advances and the full counsel of God is shared with more. If you would like to contribute to the proliferation of more workshops of gospel and God-centered material, in a word, reformed theology with a mission focus. Please let me know if you want to support workshops.
