PRAYER POINTS AUGUST 2020

“But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us” (Romans 5v8)

Praise for:

- God’s faithfulness in protecting all our staff especially those who travel to many remote often flash-point areas to carry out projects
- TASTE Nigeria being formally invited (process is only by invitation) to apply to become one of Tearfund Nigeria Partners.
- The States of Guernsey releasing £25,000 the last tranche of a £50,000 grant thus approving our request for work to be moved to two different communities. The work could not go ahead in two of the original 5 communities due to ongoing attacks in one and no suitable location for a borehole found at the other.
- The successful and encouraging meeting TASTE Country Director held with the Fulani Leadership this week Nuhu writes ***“We resolved to respond in love to the Fulani gun attacks in our Kramer district in the last two weeks some lasting up to 20 minutes. One such attack was at a farm set up to feed the internally displaced persons (IDPs) especially in response to the Covid-19 pandemic. We lost 2 motorcycles, but one was recovered having been handed over to us during the meeting. The other could not be found and we will support the owner to get a another one without charging the Fulanis for. This is our act of love to them.”***



Pray that:

- Our staff will continue to honour God in all that they do both in the UK and in Nigeria
- We would use every opportunity we get to share the Gospel with communities during our projects
- Nigeria would continue to be spared the worst of the Covid-19 pandemic so that its health service can cope
- We would eventually be able to carry out WASH projects at Jirim Gari and Dutse Bako. Although funding was available from the States of Guernsey for these two communities, no ground water was found in Jirim Gari and it was too dangerous to work in Dutse Bako due to ongoing attacks by Fulani militants.
- The proposed TASTE boreholes in Partnership with the Rotary Club in Vom, Plateau State would soon be carried out. Although £30,000 of the £60,000 project cost has been raised, the project is on hold due to the Covid-19 pandemic making fundraising for the other half very difficult
- The Fulani leaders would be able to control the aggression of their youths and that the youths from Nuhu’s community would refocus their attention back on God (specific request from Nuhu)
- Nuhu’s community would be able to get more fertilizers for the (IDP) farms (specific request from Nuhu)
- Nuhu Chayi (TASTE Nigeria Country Director) and Ben Udejiofo (CEO) know God’s will as they work towards getting a bigger drilling rig for boreholes in rock strata that the current smaller rig cannot drill through. The new rig is likely to cost in the region of £100,000
