Dear brethren,

Warm greetings to you in the glorious name of our Lord Jesus Christ, who is our only Hope in life and death. Thank you for your faithful partnership in the gospel (Phil 1:5) both prayerfully and financially. It is through such means of faithful intercession and generous giving, that the Lord has enabled us to serve Him here at TPC. The end goal being the glory of God as godly men are equipped for the work of preaching the gospel in their local churches for the salvation of sinners and strengthening of the saints. In this letter, we share with you the major activities in the month of January.

1. Student Affairs

2025 has begun with 10 new students on board. As expected, they are all First Years. Three of those students are Rwandese while the rest are Kenyan. They have all begun their studies well. Their studies were preceded with an orientation. The orientation happened on 9th January 2023 from 10am to 1:30pm.

The session helped the students in knowing more about the college and the course that is expected to take three years. Speakers and topics covered during the sessions were:

- The History and purpose of TPC – Murungi Igweta
- A testimony TPC from a TPC Alumnus – Dominic Kabaria (Pastor, Trinity Baptist Church)
- How to manage TPC work – Paul Gachungi (Pastor, Grace Reformed Baptist Church, Ruiru; a church plant of TBC).

Apart from the first years who were admitted to the college in January, all other students were present for the January module, except Gift Niyo. Gift Niyo, a student from Kigali, Rwanda, fell ill a few days before the classes and was unable to travel to Nairobi for classes. But we praise the Lord for having healed him and he is now doing well.

We pray that the new students will adjust well and that the Lord will strengthen them through their studies. We pray that God will use their experience at TPC to love God more and love the flocks that God has entrusted to them by faithfully feeding them with God's word publicly in their preaching and even privately.

2. Lectures

The First Year students were taught the Doctrine of Scripture by John Vondoloski while the Second and Third year students were taught General letters (Part 1) and Preaching by Murungi Igweta. John is an elder at Grace Immanuel Reformed Baptist Church in Grand Rapids, Michigan. John was assisted by Stephen Silamo (pastor, Trinity Baptist Church in Korr, Marsabit County). The lectures happened during the 6 days of classes, Wednesday 8th to Wednesday 15th January (except on the weekend). The students greatly profited from the labours of the two lecturers. We thank God for how the two teachers spent and were spent for the Lord's sake here at TPC. We pray that through these efforts, the Lord Jesus Christ will be magnified among the nations.

3. Assignments

After a week of classes in a given module, the students go home with assignments that require 6 to 8 weeks to complete before the next module. The purpose of the assignments is to help the students grow in knowledge and wisdom and to refine their view of God's word by reading faithful pastor-teachers and integrating the teachings grasped with their own biblical and theological reasoning in writing. We now have James Mwirigi, a TPC alumnus assisting us the grading of the students' assignments.

March Module

The March module is Hermeneutics which began on the 12th and will go on up to 19th March with Pastor Nate Davidson from Augusta GA teaching. He will be assisted by Pastor Tonny Karwa of Grace Baptist Church Kisumu. Eric Abwao will also do one of the lectures via video call.
