Dine and Listen

This is one of our church's key evangelistic ministries, where we invite neighbors, friends, and unbelievers to join us. During the event, we share a meal, engage in conversation, and most importantly, hear the gospel preached. We are grateful that many new people attended, including TPC students and some of our church members. The message was powerfully delivered by brother Ben Carlson, a TPC lecturer.

Congregational Meeting (CM)

This was our second congregational meeting. I was struck by how seriously such meetings are taken. Several important matters were discussed, including:

1. The sensitive issue of church discipline and excommunication.
2. Full transparency regarding the church's budget.
3. The sending off of missionaries.
4. The triennial evaluation of Elder Dominic.
5. And various other matters on the agenda.
